

HASKELL COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 3-21-20-6

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF HASKELL COUNTY, KANSAS BOARD OF HEALTH PROHIBITING MASS PUBLIC GATHERINGS.

NOW, on this 21st day of March, 2020, a special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Haskell County, Kansas, serving as the Board of Health for Haskell County, the following resolution is duly made and approved:

WHEREAS, both the state and federal governments have declared a public health emergency due to COVID-19 global pandemic;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, Governor Kelly issued Executive Order No. 20-04, which prohibits public and mass gatherings and makes recommendations regarding social distancing; and


WHEREAS, such conditions endanger the public health, safety and welfare of persons within the borders of Haskell County, Kansas.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, acting as the Board of Health, issued and ordered Haskell County Resolution 3-18-20-4, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-119, which addressed these issues, but included an incorrect penalty provision.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that:

1. This Resolution supersedes Haskell County Resolution No. 3-18-20-4 and as of the passage of this resolution, Haskell County Resolution is rescinded.
2. No mass gatherings of more than 10 shall be allowed.
3. A "mass gathering" shall be considered a group of people that are in one room for purposes of this order. A family gathering shall not be considered a "mass gathering" as long as all family members reside in the same home.
4. A "room" shall be considered a confined space that is entirely enclosed for purposes of this order. For purposes of defining a "room", a temporary divider that provides a floor to ceiling division may be used.
5. This resolution and all requirements under the same are effective as of March 21, 2020 at 2:00 p.m. for a period of 60 days unless terminated or extended by order of the Board of Haskell County Commissioners serving as the Board of Public Health of Haskell County, Kansas.
6. Violation of this order shall be a violation of K.S.A 65-119 and is punishable by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense, pursuant to K.S.A 65-127.

IT IS SO RESOLVED AND ORDERED.
