

HASKELL COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 5-11-20-9

A RESOLUTION OF HASKELL COUNTY, KANSAS ADDRESSING ACCESS TO THE COURTHOUSE AND EMPLOYEE SAFETY.

NOW, on this 11th day of May, 2020, a special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Haskell County, Kansas, the following resolution is duly made and approved:

WHEREAS, both the state and federal governments have declared a public health emergency due to COVID-19 global pandemic;

WHEREAS, Governor Kelly has implemented a Reopen Kansas Framework plan; and

WHEREAS, Haskell County has implemented both Haskell County Resolution No. 3-28-20-7 and 3-18-20-3 which address restrictions on entry into the courthouse and employee safety. Both resolutions are set to expire on May 17, 2020 at 11:30 a.m.; and

WHEREAS, Haskell County is confirming new cases of COVID-19 and a continued safety policy is necessary for both employees and the public.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. This resolution will take effect upon expiration of Haskell County Resolution Nos. 3-28-20-7 and 3-18-20-3. This resolution takes effect at May 17, 2020 at 11:31 a.m. and will expire on the 29 day of June, 2020 at 11:30 a.m. unless otherwise extended or shortened by resolution of the Board of Haskell County Commissioners.

2. All Haskell County buildings will be open to the public with normal working hours, subject to restrictions as set forth below.

3. All employees entering county buildings will be screened for COVID-19 upon entering county buildings. Any employee exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms will not be allowed entry into county buildings and will be placed on leave, subject to applicable federal and state laws. No employees may report for work if they know that they are positive for COVID-19 and will be subject to discipline, up to termination if they do. Employees will be allowed to return to work after being cleared by the Haskell County Health Department.

4. Only one public entrance will be allowed at each building. All persons entering county buildings will be screened for COVID-19 upon entering county buildings. Any employee exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms will not be allowed entry into county buildings.

5. All entry into the building and access to departments will be governed by Governor Kelly's Reopen Kansas Framework in addition to the other requirements of this resolution.

6. Six feet of separation will be required between employees and members of the public. Six feet of separation will also be required between members of the public unless they are members of the same family unit. Department heads will be required to implement practices that will ensure this spacing.

7. Dividers operating as sneeze guards will be installed in each county office as requested by each department head. If no sneeze guard is installed, or if employees are within six feet of the public, both employees and the members of the public will be required to wear face masks.


8. Haskell County will provide masks to both the public and employees as needed.

9. All surfaces in each office will be sanitized at least once per day.


10. Employees failing to follow safety requirements of this resolution will be subject to discipline, up to termination

11. Members of the public that fail to follow requirements of this resolution will be subject to removal from the county building. Members of the public that are unwilling to be screened will not be allowed into the building.




